Message from the Board

Autumn leaves are falling as fast as overnight temperatures, so it's time to prepare for winter and our Annual General Meeting. The AGM is traditionally held in early October, but was delayed this year because the Audit of our financial statements and reports took a little longer than expected.

The AGM will be held Monday, November 25th at 7:30 pm (sign in starts at 7:00 pm) at the Grantham Lions Club, 732 Niagara St. (at the corner of Lakeshore Road), St. Catharines. If you are unable to attend, please complete and return the Voting Proxy form included in your information package you will receive shortly. It is important that we sufficient have owners represented in person or by proxy to achieve quorum, to validate our decisions at the meeting.

There will be three Board member positions openina at this up meeting. Thanks to the individuals that submitted their Candidate Disclosure Forms indicating their intention to stand for these Board Member positions. It is important to have all owners be on the Board at some point, so they understand how a condominium Board works and what's involved in making decisions that are in the best interest of everyone.



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At the conclusion of the AGM, we will have a brief, second meeting to make a special announcement and have a question and answer session. Please stick around for the announcement.

As far as the financial health of the condominium is concerned, there are no surprises so far this year. Owners are up to date with their fees and our expenses are very much in line with our budget. Over the past two or three years, during the 'post pandemic' period of high inflation and shortages of just about everything, we've held back on our discretionary spending. The money we saved is earning interest at a higher rate than expected.

Likely, over the next two or three years we are going to have to start spending some more money to keep our homes and gardens looking as beautiful as they always have been. Having accumulated two years of surplus operating funds will allow us to do that, while keeping fee increases to the minimum necessary.

Trillium Gardens Fall Cleanup and Transition to Winter Has Started



It's officially fall and it's time to pack up our shorts and gratefully bring out the sweater and long pants. It is a fantastic time to clean our gardening tools and plant spring bulbs. Yard cleanup is on the menu as winter approaches.

Rempel Landscaping, our grounds contractor, has already been here to cut back some shrubs. They will be



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on site several times before the snow flies to finish leaf and debris removal, prune the fourteen common garden beds, prune the Panicle hydrangea standards on garden fronts unit and Incrediball hydrangeas along the Parkside fence. All the fountain planted throughout arass grounds will be cut to ground level. This is also the best time of year to prune the yew hedges in front of some units down to window ledge level and away from the air conditioner unit behind to provide clean air flow. We have asked Rempel to rake certain areas where tree debris has fallen along the fence with Colonial Florist. The work will be ongoing.

The privacy cedar hedge between units received a ragged top cut this summer, as planned. The tops were left over the summer so that new cedar branches would fill in the cut areas, and they have. In the spring, the cedar tops will then be trimmed to a round shape and the sides trimmed as well. A solid privacy fence is planned that going forward can be easily and safely maintained. It has taken time but will be worth the wait.

This is our first year for Rempel Landscaping to maintain our common grounds and some issues have developed that require attention. The Board is very aware of the damage to grass done by the riding mower and the lack of weeding in character with what we

have expected over the years. The has met with Board Landscape to discuss steps needed to mitigate the problems. We asked about the use of only hand mowers for cutting the grass. waiting for a revised quote to consider this specific request as costs increase with this added labour. Rempel has also walked the ground with us and assures the areas damaged by the mower will be repaired in the spring with top dressing and grass seed when the weather is more co-operative with rain and temperature.

I would urge you to take a look outside your unit now and prune back any shrubs/branches close to your furnace PVC pipes. Like myself, many owners have found their pipes blocked by drifting snow and no furnace operation. It is a cold start to the day.

September Street Party


