POLICY – PLANTING ALONG PARKSIDE DRIVE

The following policy created for Niagara North Vacant Land Condominium Corporation No. 232 has been adopted to provide guidance regarding planting **by owners** in the common areas along Parkside Drive.

Prior to any alteration to the common area, notification to the Board of Directors specifying compliance with the following guidelines is required and should be forwarded to Chown Management.

The policy and guidelines reflect two significant considerations:

- The original plantings which are located on the common elements (refer to "Unit Common Elements" Definition for more detail) or subsequent planting undertaken by the Condominium Corporation are to be replaced by the condominium when necessary. These plantings are identified in the site landscape plan and any replacement or alteration by the condominium corporation will be documented. *If owners want to add or replace plantings in these areas, the owner is responsible for future replacement*. Any exception to this is at the discretion of the condominium corporation.
- Access to the rear yards and to the common area between Sandalwood and Blossom is required for grounds maintenance and grass cutting and can not be impeded.
- 1. Each unit owner holds the sole responsibility for all cost including materials, application and/or damage.
- 2. A variety of small trees, shrubs and flowering plants are allowed but should be consistent with existing landscaping with respect to size and colour. Mature height should not exceed 15 feet.
- 3. Trees/shrubs with an invasive root structure are not permitted.
- 4. Nothing should be planted that will cause unattractive/messy debris (e.g. berries, leaves) in the common areas or on sidewalks.
- 5. Nothing should be planted that impedes access to rear yards for grounds maintenance.
- 6. Garden edging including brick may be used provided that drainage and access for grass cutting is not obstructed.

The attached list of plants was prepared by resident garden "experts" and provides owners with a variety of alternative trees and shrubs that would comply with these guidelines.
