#### **Activity Update from the Board**

Lawns, Gardens, Driveways, Swales...

What is going on around here?

It's nice to have a Property Manager that's on top of things and is paying attention to our Condo.



Neil Wachs, of Greenbelt Property Management, our new Property

Manager, has been busy executing the various requests and decisions of the Board. Each decision we come up with usually requires a couple of requests for quotations from service providers, which in turn generate further questions. Where do we start?

Lawns it is. It has been a couple of winters and one summer season since we switched to our new landscaper, Tim Rempel. The first winter with Rempel was so mild, it didn't really give us a chance to evaluate their service. This winter made up for it and Tim and his crew had a very busy February keeping our roads and driveways cleared of snow and ice.

With respect to Team Rempel's lawn care, there were some concerns expressed by owners that the larger riding mower/grass collector being used on the front lawns was too big for our smaller, narrow front lawns.

We went back to Tim and asked that the front lawns and some specific areas between the homes now be mowed by push mowers. The clippings will get mulched and in turn, feed the lawns, but there will be some extra time, effort and cost required to cut the lawns this way. You will see this change starting right away.

Common Garden Beds. Tim's crew has been working on our common garden beds last week, adding a soil amendment to the garden beds. To mulch or not to mulch. The Board decided not to mulch, but rather, add triple-mix.



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This will give the plants more nutrients (from the manure), and moisture retaining peat moss, and a better chance to thrive and keep our place looking beautiful.

Driveways. The famous song by Patsy Cline "I Fall to Pieces" might be appropriate right about now. This winter was hard on the driveways, especially the ones on the south side of the streets, at the homes backing on to Colonial Florist.



For what ever reason, either the initial build quality was less than satisfactory, or the fact that they are in shade throughout the winter – resulting in a deeper frost depth and increased frost *heave*, these driveways have not lasted as long and are now deteriorating. This was pointed out by the engineer conducting the on-site Reserve Fund Study Property Inspection.

Driveway replacement activity is scheduled in the next couple of

years, and we are checking to see how much it would be to repair, or seal the cracks now, and possibly extend the working lives of the driveways. Further discussion on this expensive topic and the other findings from the Reserve Fund Study is required, and will likely be a specific topic at the AGM in November.

Swales. For owners with homes backing along the Colonial Flowers fence line, this has been a topic of discussion for a couple of years now. In light of the more frequent severe rain events we have been having of late, it seems the efficiency of the swales could be improved in some specific areas.





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We have had the hardest time getting contractors to come and even look at the job, let alone give us a quote on the proposed work Thanks to Neil Wachs required. our Property Manager, we had two quotes to evaluate. A supplier has been selected - Outdoor Oasis Landscaping and will be remediating, re-grading and improving the swale's efficiency by addina weeping tile а underground drain in a bed of gravel connected to the storm drain below ground). This work, some of which will be done by machine, some is to be done by hand digging, will start in June. Owners affected by this work will receive a separate letter indicating the timing and scope of the work.

The past few years, the Board's focus has been on Cost Savings. Every contract and expense was evaluated and alternative, lower cost suppliers investigated. have done well keeping our costs in line, or in some areas, actually reducing our costs, in order to keep our monthly fees in check. Funds saved have earned a higher rate of interest than expected, and the extra funds will be available to us for future expenditures. There have been no fee increases in a couple of years, even though we have had some hefty increases in our Reserve Fund contributions each month.

By now you will have received our Budget, and noticed \$10/month fee increase. This was necessary to keep up with the higher cost of just about everything over the past several As the Board's focus years. changes from Cost Savings to Property and Grounds Maintenance and Improvements, we will have to start spending some money again. We will continue to seek the best value for our expenditures and find suppliers that provide quality service at fair prices.
